## Word Study Homework (Menu #3)

Directions: Choose 4-5 different activities to complete throughout the next two weeks. Mark off the box with a "X." Remember, before completing an activity, you should **SORT** your spelling words. It's also a good idea to practice writing and sorting your words. I'll be able to tell how much you're practicing by how well you do on your Word Study (Spelling) tests.

<p><b>Sort with Reflection</b></p> <p>Cut your words. Sort words while reading each word aloud into the same categories you did in school. Reflect about how and why you put your words into those categories. (Think about the sorting.)</p>	<p><b>SAW</b></p> <p>(Sort, Alphabetize and Write)</p> <p>Sort your words, alphabetize the words within their categories, and then write down the sort onto paper.</p>	<p>Visit <a href="http://www.spellingcity.com">www.spellingcity.com</a>. Enter your words and choose a game to play. (There is NOT an account set up due to numerous groups. You can enter your own words.)</p>
<p><b>Beat the Adult</b></p> <p>An adult or older sibling sorts the words while being timed by you. Then you try to beat the adult's time while sorting your words. On paper, record the sort, write who won, and explain why you think that person won.</p>	<p><b>Writing Sort</b></p> <p>Write your words in the appropriate category and spell the words correctly.</p>	<p><b>Word Hunt</b></p> <p>Look in books, newspapers, or magazines to find more words with the same pattern or rule you are studying. Write them down in the categories they would belong to.</p>
<p><b>Highlight the Pattern</b></p> <p>Write each word in pencil. Ex. soil Find the feature of the word being studied and highlight it in crayon or marker.</p>	<p><b>Blind Sort</b></p> <p>Lay out the Keywords. Mix up the cards and have someone call out the word. You must point to the correct category (or call out the Keyword) without seeing the word. If you call out the correct Keyword, your partner will place it in the category. If not, you will try again.</p>	<p><b>Typing</b></p> <p>Type your words and send them to Mrs. Becerra (email or Google Classroom). BONUS: Type them in categories.</p>
